When our new daughter was born, we ended up losing our housing because we had too many people in our one bedroom apartment. Even though I was awarded sole custody of my older daughter, we were knocked two steps back and become

homeless again. So where do I turn? Four children, nowhere to go and I ended up losing my job. I was able to move in with my sister, but it was very crowded with her family and all my

little ones under 5. We started sleeping in my truck. I was literally hoping for a miracle every day and considered turning to Child Protective Services for housing availability. When I got a call from St. Stephen Housing Association, it was one of the best phone calls of our lives! During the time I've been in the program I've enrolled in college and I also got the chance to go see my mom who I hadn't seen since the birth of my youngest. It was great! The kids enjoyed themselves and got all the love from my mom they've been missing from grandma. I want to thank Patti Bergrud for coming into our lives and putting me into a better place in life to make it possible to go to school and raise my kids at the same time. I've even developed better relationships with my kids' mothers. I'm planning to graduate in early January


